ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

ALASKA FEDERATION OF FILIPINO AMERICANS, INC.

We, the undersigned residents of the State of Alaska, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of incorporating a non-profit corporation under the laws of the State of Alaska; and we do hereby execute and adopt the following Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I

The name of this Corporation shall be: Alaska Federation of Filipino Americans, Inc.

ARTICLE II

The period of existence of this Corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE III

The objects and purposes for which the Corporation is formed are as follows:

- (a) To provide assistance to charitable institutions providing social services in Alaska and to needy individuals in distress or who have suffered loss due to fortuitous events or calamity.
- (b) To provide comprehensive public services to those who need assistance in understanding governmental structures, functions and/or services.
- (c) To provide leadership, educational and literary training to the youth and adults.
- (d) To perpetuate Filipino values and cultural heritage through educational and instructional practices.
- (e) To provide scholarship assistance to deserving individuals.
- (f) To help develop the community and promote a better way of life to Filipino Americans in Alaska through beautification and the promotion of health and public safety.
- (g) The Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, including for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt

organizations under section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code. All funds whether income or principal, and whether acquired by gift or contribution or otherwise, shall be devoted to said purposes.

ARTICLE IV

In order to achieve its objectives and purposes, the Corporation shall, working with and through a Board of Directors:

- (a) Conduct fund raising activities to fund the development, promotion and maintenance of programs and activities;
- (b) Develop programs to provide public services to people in areas of health, education, public safety and governmental issues;
- (c) Develop programs to provide leadership and educational training and literacy to the youth and adults;
- (d) Develop programs to perpetuate Filipino values and cultural heritage;
- (e) Develop programs to assist deserving individuals in search of scholarship resources;
- (f) Participate actively in community beautification projects.

ARTICLE V DEDICATION CLAUSE

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributed to its members, officers, directors, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall may pay reasonable compensation for services rendered to or for the corporation in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article III. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidates for political office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future tax code.

ARTICLE VI DISTRIBUTION CLAUSE

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county or judicial district in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE VII

The initial registered office of the Corporation is 3911 Marquis Way, Anchorage, Alaska 99502. The initial Registered Agent at such address is Angel J. Sargento.

ARTICLE VIII

The principal office of Corporation shall be in Anchorage, Alaska. The service area of the Corporation shall be limited to the State of Alaska.

ARTICLE IX

The management of the Corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors which shall consist of not less than five (5) nor more than fifteen (15) persons appointed pursuant to the By-laws of the Corporation and having such qualifications as set forth in the By-laws; provided, however, that the initial Directors of the Corporation shall be seven (7 in number as forth below:
